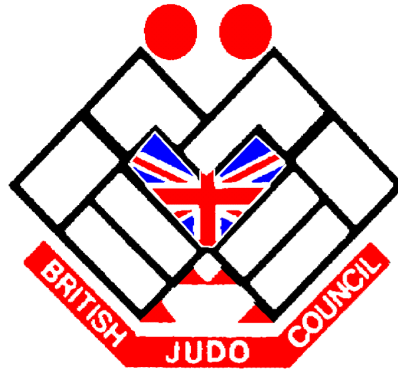

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Entrants must produce a current BJC licence on the day.
2. Entrants licence must include a photograph and date of birth.
3. Closing date for all advance entries will be last post 14th June 2011.
4. Entries are allowed on the day but are subject to a £2 surcharge.
5. Only team managers will be allowed to consult with the Mat Marshal.
6. Competitors may only enter 1 category.
7. The BJC reserve the right to photograph or film all or any part of the tournament.

COMPETITION REGULATIONS

1. No coaching will be allowed during the competition.
2. Judogi must comply with current BJC contest rules (Oct 2010).
3. Females must wear a plain white t-shirt.
4. No refreshments to be taken to the side of the mat. Drinking water will be available from the "table".
5. All competitors must comply with the regulations regarding footwear, i.e. Zori's only to be worn to the side of the mat. Trainers and everyday shoes are not permitted.
6. Where there are sufficient numbers, categories will be fought in preliminary round pools, then knockout.
7. Where permitting, Gold, Silver and 2 Bronze awards will be made in all categories.
8. BJC Updated Contest rules can be viewed on the website.
9. No blue judogi; no reversible coloured judogi; no shoulder stripes; zoris are required to the mat; insignia whether badge or embroidered on the sleeves of the judogi must comply with bjc regulations i.e. shall not measure greater than 10cm x 10cm

BATSUGUN PROMOTION.

This means instant promotion without the necessity of theoretical examination or demonstration of the required kata for a particular grade. Gradings for Dan promotion can include, theoretical examination, demonstration of Kata and contest with minimum win/s of waza-ari. The contest can be of pool compilation or a line up. With this in mind the requirement of wins for Batsugun must be fairly stringent. i.e.

Generally.

Each win in the tally total for promotion will be counted at 1 point regardless of ippon or waza-ari score.

Graded judoka

5 wins are required (5 points), 3 by standing ippon 2 by waza-ari only one of which can be achieved by a win in Ne-Waza. A person who can only gain a maximum 4 ippon wins in the group and does so, **may** be given further opportunity.

- A win against one grade higher merits 1.5 points
- A win against two grade higher merits 2 points
- A win against one lower grade merits 0.5 points. (half a point)
- A win against two or more grades lower, no merit for Batusgun

Veterans of 35 plus.

4 wins. (4 points) are required. 3 by standing ippon, 1 by waza-ari which can be achieved in Ne-Waza.

- A win against one grade higher, or a win against a same grade level but 5 years younger, merits 1.5 points
- A win against a person two or more grades higher, or a win against the same grade level but 10 years younger, merits 2 points.
- A win against a lower grade merits 0.5 points regardless of age difference.
- A win against an equal grade five years older or more, merits 0.5 points.
- A win against a grade two or more lower, no merit for Batsugun.

Veterans of 40 plus

- 4 wins. (4 points) are required. 2 by standing ippon, 2 by waza-ari one of which can be achieved in Ne-Waza.
- A win against one grade higher, or equal grade 5 years younger, merits 1.5 points.
- A win against a person two or more grades higher, or a win against the same grade level but 10 years younger, merits 2 points.
- A win against a lower grade merits 0.5 point regardless of age difference
- A win against two or more grade lower regardless of age difference no merit for Batsugun

The grade and age differences cannot be utilised together i.e. a forty five year old 2nd Dan beating a forty year old 3rd Dan cannot be credited with 1.5 points for the age difference and 1.5 points for the grade difference making a total of 3 points from the one win.

Other factors may be taken into consideration including:

- i. Time of over ten years in a grade.
- ii. Age of over fifty years,.
